## TROY FOUNDATION

In 2017 The Piqua Learning Place was purchased by Romer's Catering & Entertainment Facilities Inc. At that time Tony Sherry was instrumental in establishing a fund whereby our club receives 50% of the interest earned from that sale. Each year we receive between \$12,000 and \$17,000 based on the funds prior year's performance.

The fund is held in a special account within the Troy Foundation which includes certain spending restrictions. It can only be spent on nonprofits, it must be available to Piqua residents, it cannot be used for specific individuals (i.e. not allowed for scholarships), and it must be completely spent each year.
