## EXERCISE THOSE "GEARS" BETWEEN YOUR EARS

Give the following puzzlers a try! (answers will appear in next month's newsletter)

1. Can you name three consecutive days without using the words Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday,Saturday, or Sunday?
2. What word is the same backwards and upside down?

Challenge I - Move two matchsticks from the following figure to create a figure with exactly four triangles.

solution: move the 2 leftmost sticks to fill in at the bottom and make 4 triangles as shown below.


Challenge 2 - Move three matchsticks to create a figure with five triangles.

solution: move the 3 sticks in the triangle at the right down to the bottom to form 4 small triangles plus one big triangle formed by the outter sticks!
