PIQUA K-KIDS ARE OFF AND RUNNING!

October 13 was the first meeting of our latest student service program, Piqua Catholic K-Kids. With K-Kids programs at Piqua Central, Springcreek, Washington, and now Piqua Catholic, we are the only Kiwanis club in the area to cover all of the elementary schools in our town.

Chartered in 2009, Springcreek is our oldest K-Kids program. Two years later, both Piqua Central and Washington were formed. It took a while, but twelve years later Piqua Cahtolic joined our K-Kids family with 14 kids signed up for the program.

K-Kids is a student service program geared for children ages 6 through 12 with a focus on teaching the value of serving others.
