The History of Piqua Kiwanis Pancake Day

With 2024 marking our 69th year of our pancake day, it is fitting that we take a look at the history of this event.

It all started in 1955 when we flipped our first pancakes at the Greene Street United Methodist Church. The event was initially chaired by Dr. Kenneth Lyon and pancakes were actually served by "Aunt Jemima".

Since "Aunt Jemima" was actually a brand name and not a real person, it begs the question, "who actually served our pancakes?"

Nancy Green was hired in the 1890's as the original Aunt Jemima. In 1923 she was struck by an automobile in Chicago and died. So Nancy Green couldn't have been our server.

Following Green's death, a handful of women were hired to be "Aunt Jemima" until the brand was dropped in 2020. Most of these women did not qualify as our server due to a death prior to 1955, their age at that time, or their geographical location. There was one, however, that could have been a contender, Rosa Washington Riles.

Rosa was born in 1901 in Red Oak, Ohio and buried in 1969 in the same town. Rosa was recruited by Quaker Oats to portray Aunt Jemima and during her lifetime she traveled around the country making public appearances portraying Aunt Jemima. Unless an older club member knows for sure, we may never truly know the identity of the woman who served our pancakes.

Moving ahead seven years to 1962, the Armory became the new home for our Pancake Day event. Lee VanDervort was the chair of the event at that time and Aunt Jemima once again made an appearance and helped serve pancakes. As in 1955 the exact identity of this Aunt Jemina was not recorded in our Pancake Day history, but we can make a strong case once again for Rosa Washington Riles.

The following year, 1963, Walter Schumacher initiated the use of the carousel pancake grills. These grills have been in continuous use ever since and will be in use again at this year's Pancake Day.

In 2007 the club voted to move Pancake Day to the Upper Valley JVS, now the Upper Valley Career Center, where it is still being held to this day.
