PANCAKE ACHIEVEMENTS

Pancake Day, our biggest fundraiser of the year, occurs next month. We served our first pancake breakfast back in 1955 and have flipped thousands of cakes since. You could say that we are experts when it comes to pancakes, and that would be a valid claim. But what are others claiming when it comes to flapjacks? Below are some verified "pancake" claims.

According to Guinness World Records, the largest pancake ever made was in England in 1994. It was 49 feet 3 inches in diameter, 1 inch thick, and weighed in at 6,614 pounds. The Co-operative Union Ltd in Rochdale, England, was responsible for the pancake.

Our cakes are made using hand-held batter dispensers and five foot rotating griddles. The Co-op used a 50 foot pan and filled it with batter from a tanker truck.

Our pancakes are flipped by hand. The Co-op used two cranes to turn their record-breaking pancake.

Our cakes take a few minutes to cook, whereas the Co-op needed 4 hours to cook theirs.

So, what happened to the giant pancake? It was cut up into 15,000 portions and sold off with the proceeds going to local charities.

Guinness World Records also recorded the world's highest pancake toss (or flip). While we gently flip our pancakes a few inches off the griddle, Dominic Cuzzacrea managed to toss a pancake 31 ft 1 in into the air. The feat was achieved at Walden Galleria Mall in Cheektowaga, New York, USA, on 13 November 2010.

We like to limit our servings to a couple of flapjacks. After all, it's all you can eat, so folks can return for more. **Pancakes On The Rocks**, a restaurant in Australia, had a different idea of serving size. In 2025 The restaurant snagged a Guinness record by successfully stacking 230 pancakes on a plate. The stack measured just over three and a half feet tall.

There are many other pancake records out there, but I only have space for one more.

We run our pancake breakfast from 7am to 1pm. That's six hours of serving pancakes. We also serve over 400 breakfasts. To estimate the number of cakes we probably serve, let's assume 430 breakfasts and an average of 2-1/2 pancakes per breakfast. That comes out to 1,075 pancakes. It's a rough estimate, but I'm pretty sure we flip over 1,000 pancakes in six hours. That sounds like a lot, and it is. But the Chinook Centre mall, in Canada, set a record for the most pancakes served during its Stampede Breakfast event.

They served 26,994 pancakes in just under 4-1/2 hours. Until then, an IHOP in Santa Monica, California had the record at 25,689.

We may not serve the biggest pancake or the most pancakes, or even set a Guinness record, but we will continue to provide a top-quality breakfast to our guests and in the process raise funds that allow us to benefit our local community.
